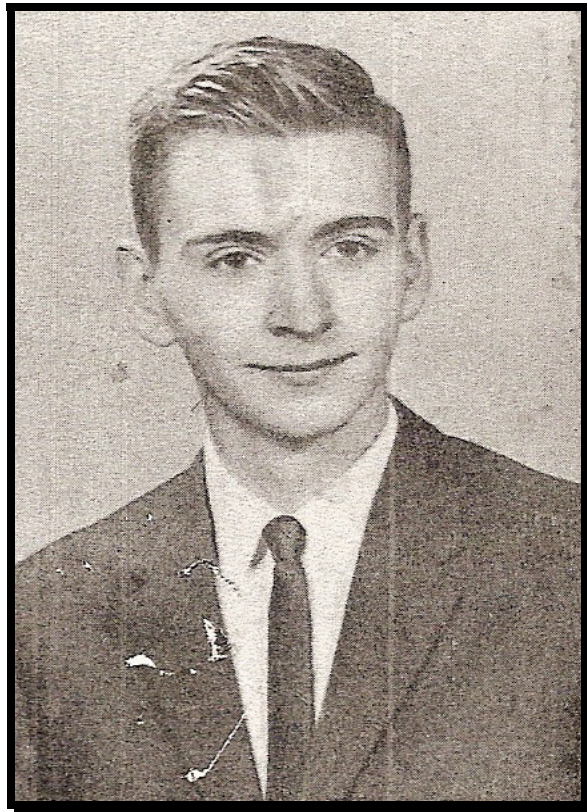
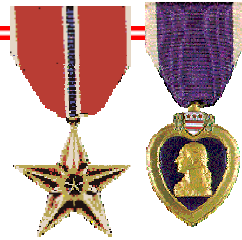

## Mount Clemens Army Captain Killed in War

Mount Clemens –Army Capt. Charles L. Baldwin, 24, son of Mrs. Wilhelmina P. Baldwin, 35 Stapleton, and the late Mr. Baldwin, was killed Aug 27 in Vietnam while a passenger in a vehicle that encountered a hostile force.

Arrangements have not been completed for sending the body home.

Capt. Baldwin was graduated from Mount Clemens High School in 1963 and from Michigan Tech in 1967.

He was commissioned through the ROTC program at Michigan Tech. He entered the service in August 1967 and arrived in Vietnam last February.

### **Charles L. Baldwin**

Mount Clemens – Capt. Charles L. Baldwin, 24, of 35 Stapleton, was killed in action Aug. 27 in Vietnam.

Capt. Baldwin was born May 22, 1945 in Mount Clemens and graduated Mount Clemens High School. He entered the Army in 1967 after graduation from Michigan Technological University and sent to Vietnam in February of this year.

He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church and a former Sunday School teacher.

Capt. Baldwin is survived by his mother, Mrs. Wilhelmina Baldwin, and his paternal grandmother, Mrs. Bertha Baldwin, of Backus, Minn.

Services will be at 1 p.m. Monday at the D.N. Cooley Funeral Home, 140 S. Gratiot, and at 1:30 p.m. at Trinity Lutheran Church with Rev. Edward G. Oermann officiating. Burial will be in Clinton Grove Cemetery, Clinton Township.
