## **SP4 Ronald Chalou Killed in Vietnam**

MOUNT CLEMENS- SP4 Ronald D. Chalou, 18, was killed in action in Vietnam July 13. He was the son of Mrs. Beatrice Croteau, 38275 Rienold, Harrison Township and Raymond Chalou of Detroit.

Chalou attended Centerline High School before enlisting in the Army in October, 1967. He served in Germany before volunteering for Vietnam duty in September 1968. He was patrol leader there.

Says his mother, "he loved his country and felt it was his duty to serve."

Chalou is survived by his parents: three sisters, Mrs. Susan Orton, Vicky and Marilyn, a brother, Larry; and two nieces, Annette and Jeanette.
