Roseville GI Dies in Vietnam

Roseville – A young couple's dream of spending their first Christmas together was shattered forever Sunday when the 20 – year-old husband, serving with the 4th Infantry in Vietnam, died from “metal fragments from hostile motor rounds.”

The Latest Macomb County Vietnam casualty is SP4 Walter L. Clark, husband of Mrs. Janet Clark, 29156 Coolidge, and the son of former Roseville residents, Mr. and Mrs. Eathel Clark, now of 17700 Avage, Belleville.

Spec.4 Clark had been serving in Vietnam since last December, and was due back in the United States on Dec. 12

“My husband never wrote much about what he was doing in Vietnam,” the young, 20 year-old widow said. “He was just living for the day when he would be coming home,” she said.

The couple, who were students together at Roseville High School, were married June 18, 1966. They had no children.

Clark was drafted into the service in March, 1966, and received his infantry training at Ft. Riley, Kansas.

The Young soldier's body will be returned home for burial with full military honors within two weeks. Funerals arrangements are incomplete.

Mrs. Clark makes her home with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Harold Stalker, 29156 Coolidge.
