ST. CLAIR SHORES – Services for Spc. 4 Mark L. Dickson, 19, of 23131 Allor Street, who was killed March 16, while fighting in the Central Highlands of Vietnam, will be at 1 p.m. Tuesday at the Will and Schwarzkoff Funeral Home, 233 North Gratiot, Mount Clemens.

The Rev. Troy O. Douthit, of Good Shepherd Methodist Church, will officiate, and full military honors will be accorded him by Headquarters Battery, 28<sup>th</sup> Artillery Group of Selfridge AFB.

Burial will be in Clinton Grove Cemetery.

Born April 23, 1948, in Mount Clemens, the son of Clyde and Mildred Hodgins Dickson, he was a graduate of Lake Shore High School and a member of the /Vanguards of Bruce Post 1146 VFW Drum and Bugle Corps.

In February, 1966, he enlisted in the Army and took paratrooper training with the 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division at Fort Campbell, Ky. He had been stationed in Vietnam since Jan. 4, as a member of the 503<sup>rd</sup> Infantry.

He is survived by his parents, Clyde and Mildred Dickson; two sisters living at home, Terry and Tamera, and his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Mildred Little, of Mount Clemens.
