Full military honors will be observed graveside at Resurrection Cemetery for First Lt. David M. Drob, 21, of 21011 Nunneley, Clinton Township, following funeral services Saturday.

Services will be at 10:30 a.m. at Kaul Funeral Home, 27830 Gratiot, Roseville, followed by 11 a.m. mass at St. Dorothy Church, Warren, with the Rev. Father Raymond J. Marshall officiating.

A rosary will be recited at 8 p.m. Friday at the funeral home.

Born Nov. 25, 1946, in Mount Clemens, Lt. Drob was killed in an ambush July 22, in Vietnam.

A graduate of Lincoln High School, Warren, in 1965, he had attended Macomb Community College for a year before entering the Army April 26, 1967.

Lt. Drob was stationed with the 137th Engineer Co. near Qui Nhon, Vietnam.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Drob, of Clinton Township; brothers, Robert, Jr. and Donald, sisters Victoria and Holly, all at home; and his paternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Paul Drob, of California.
