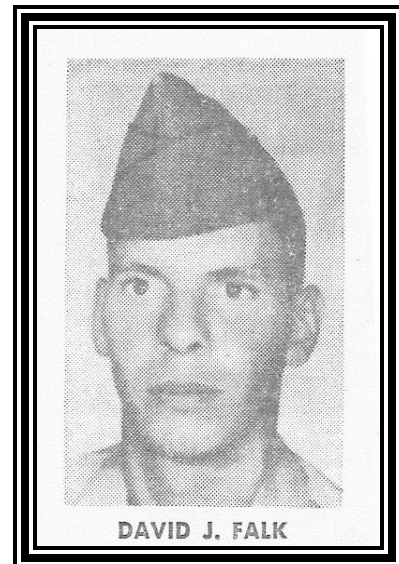
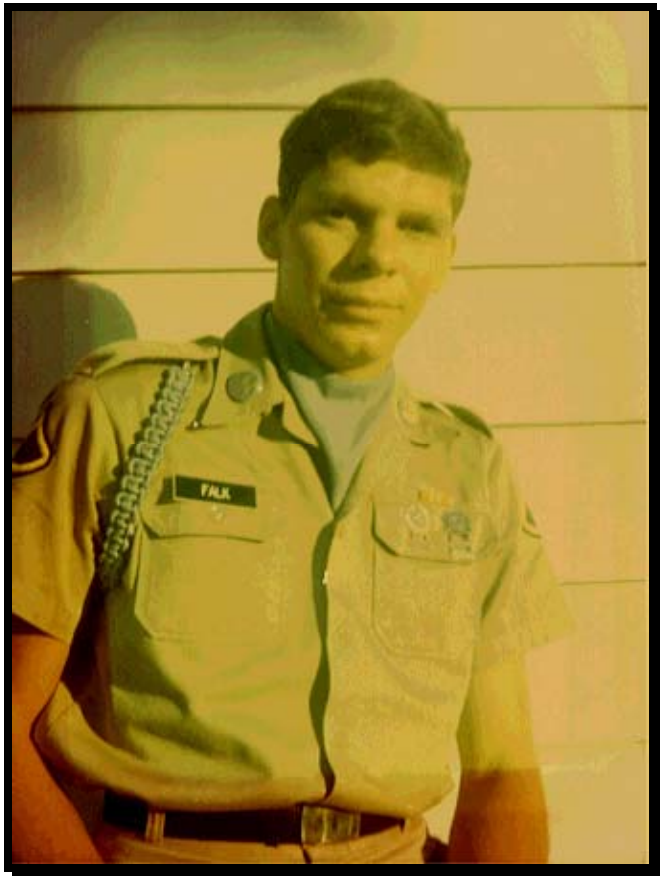

GI is killed by U.S. fire

A Sterling Heights serviceman was killed by U.S. artillery fire near the Cambodian border in Vietnam, the Defense Department announced today.

A telegram received by Mr. and Mrs. Frederick C. Falk Sr. said their son, Staff Sgt. David J. Falk, died Monday when "night support artillery directed at a hostile force landed in the area."

Falk, 22, was a crew chief for a mortar group with the 1st Cavalry Division, assigned to Tay Ninh Province, 50 miles northwest of Saigon.

Falk was drafted in February 1969, and reached Vietnam last January. He was promoted to staff sergeant in six months by finishing high in noncommissioned officers school classes in Fort Benning, Ga.

Falk had graduated with honors from Cass Tech and received an associate degree in industrial technology from the Macomb Community College.

He had planned to finish his schooling at Wayne State University.
