Roseville Soldier Killed in Vietnam

ROSEVILLE- His last letter home was written by candlelight in his foxhole in the jungles of Vietnam.

Now he is dead, killed in action by hostile small arms fire.

He was Pfc. Tracy L. Jones, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. EricL. Jones, 18519 Mesle.

"Tracy Didn't want people back home to know how bad conditions really are," his mother said.

"He never wrote us about it and he wished the press wouldn't say so much."

Pfc. Jones had married the former Sandra Rantz one week before leaving for Vietnam six months ago.

He joined the Army in November, 1965. He had worked at Chevrolet Motor Division of General Motors in Warren after attending Roseville High School.

In addition to his wife and parents, he is survived by two older brothers, Carl and Wayne.

ROSEVILLE – Tracy L. Jones, 21, will be buried Monday in he veterans section of Cadillac Memorial Gardens East, Clinton Township.

He died Feb. 12 in Vietnam – killed in action by enemy small arms fire.

Jones joined the Army in November 1965, and six months ago – a week before he was shipped to Vietnam – he married the former Sandra Rentz.

The young soldier was born June 7, 1945, in Grosse Pointe Farms and attended Northeastern and Roseville High Schools.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Eric L. Jones and two brothers, Wayne, of Sterling Township and Carl of Roseville.
