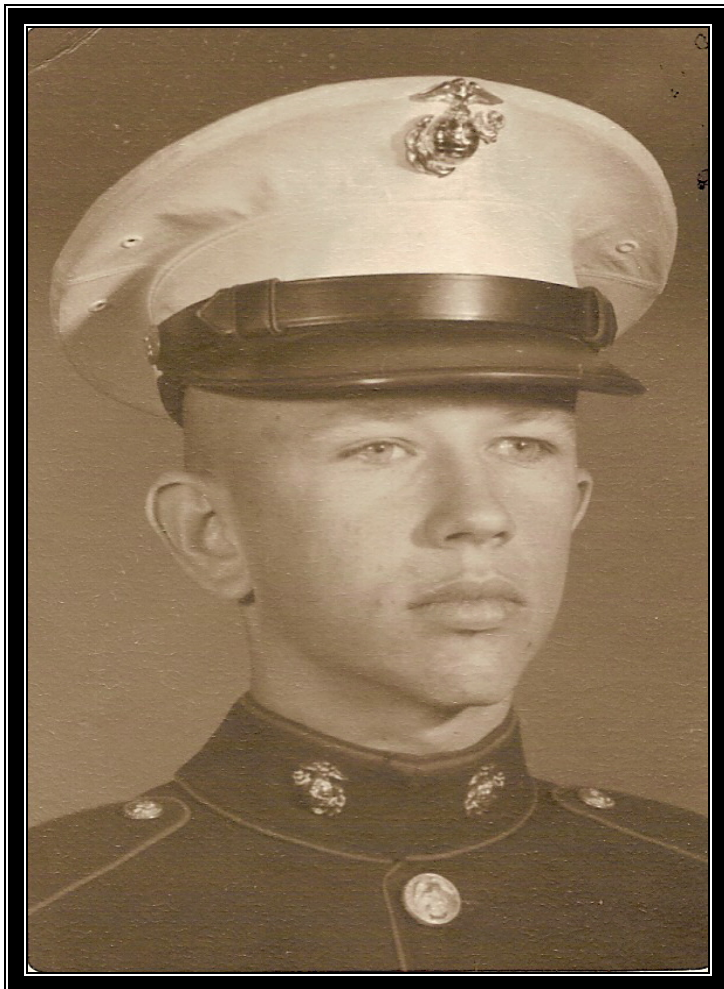

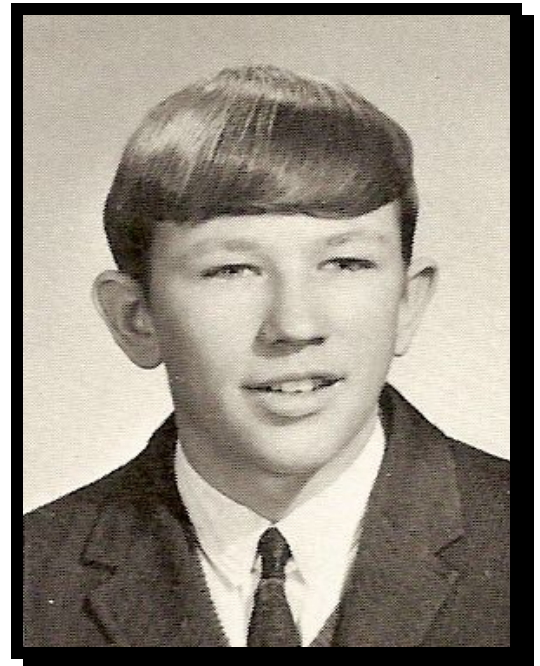

## Roy Mrosewske

MOUNT CLEMENS – Roy Mrosewske, 159 Gallup, was fatally wounded May 10, 21 miles south of Vandergrift Combat Base, Quang Tri Province, in Vietnam.

Born in Mount Clemens Nov. 7, 1948, to William P. and Ida Teise Mrosewske, he made his home in Shelby Township before moving to Mount Clemens and the present address 10 years ago.

A graduate of Mount Clemens High School in 1968, he worked as a gas station attendant before entering the United States Marine Corps in October 1968. Before going to Vietnam he was stationed at Camp Pendleton, Calif.

Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Ida Mrosewske of the above address; his father, William P., of Shelby Township, and his grandmother, Mrs. Wanda Teise of Utica. Also surviving are five brothers and sisters; William, of Clawson, Dennis, stationed at Fort Devons, Mass.; Donald, Jackie, Lee and Christine, all living at home.
