Utica Soldier Dies in Action in Vietnam

Utica – Mrs. Leo Muszynski, 8151 Grace, held the telegram in her hand and stared at it in disbelief.

It was from the War Department and the message was tense.

“We regret to inform you . . .” it began.

Frank Muszynski, 26, was dead in Viet Nam.

He died May 19. The War Department said the “Exact circumstances” of Muszynski’s death are unknown and that supplemental information would be given the family later.

Mrs. Muszynski gently fingered the telegram

“Last Friday we received a letter from Frank,” she said softly. “He told us that he had just been promoted to sergeant.

“He said in the letter that his best buddy had been killed, just a few feet away from him.”

Frank attended Utica high school and enlisted in the Army in 1959.

Soon after Frank married Pamela Missall of Seattle, Wash., and the couple made their home there. Now his wife is left with their one son, Wayne, five years old.

Frank’s, 22 year-old brother Johnny, a specialist fourth class in the Army, will be coming home from Germany, where he is stationed, to attend his brother’s funeral.

Military funeral services will be held at 10 a.m, Saturday at Milliken Funeral Home, 8459 Hall, Utica.

Burial will be at St. Lawrence Cemetery, Utica.
