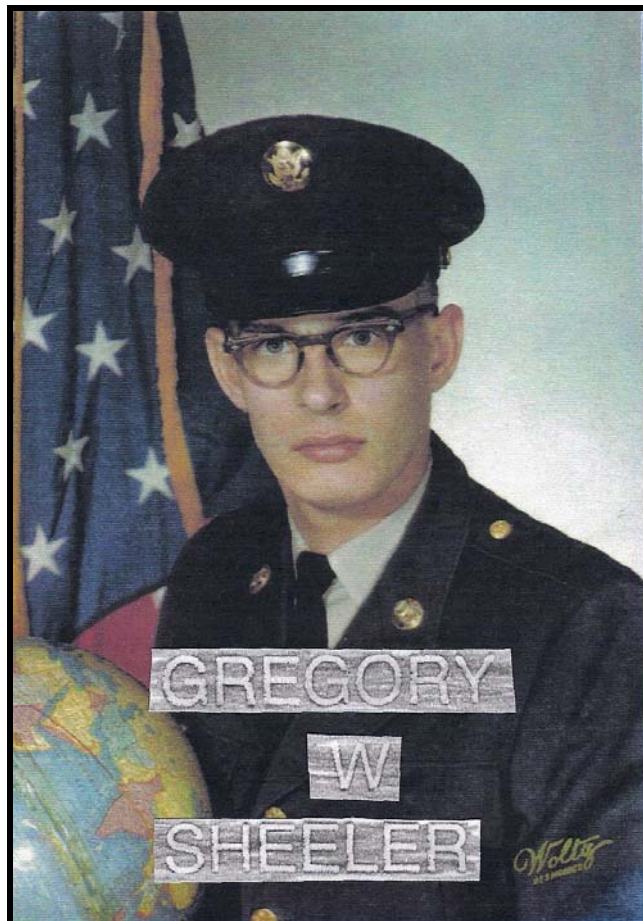

Sheeler, ward of Claude R. Barker of Mount Clemens, and Pfc. Alan H. Gross, husband of Mrs. Elsa A. Gross of 30144 Roan, Warren.
