NEW BALTIMORE – A full military burial will be held for Frederick G. Steffen on Friday in Oakwood Cemetery. Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. in St. John Lutheran Church with the Rev. Elton J. Mellum officiating.

A U. S. Navy hospital corpsman assigned to a Marine unit, Mr. Steffen was killed in action in Quang Tri Province, Vietnam, on Friday, May 24, only 17 days after he had arrived in Vietnam.

He was born in Mt. Clemens on Feb. 26, 1948, to Donald F. and Alice Barney Steffen and was graduated from Anchor Bay High School in 1966. He entered the Navy in December 1966.

His brother Dennis, also a Navy corpsman stationed at Camp LeJeune in North Carolina, flew to the West Coast to accompany the body home.
