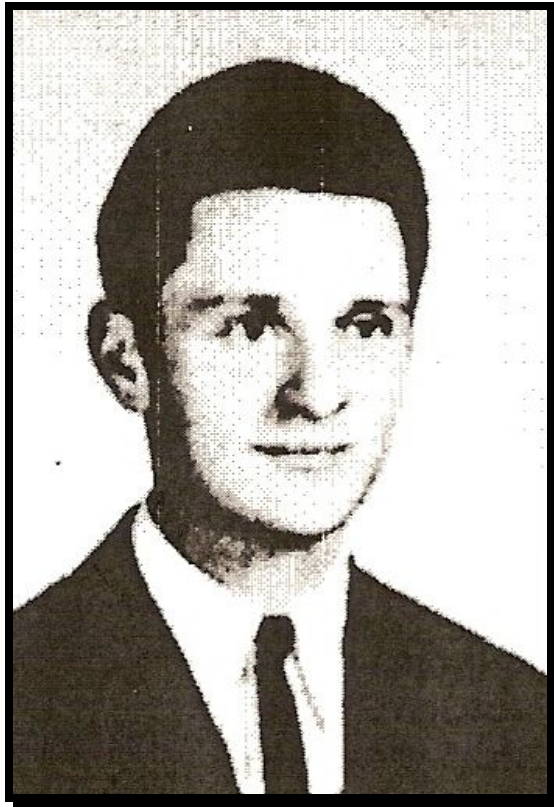

Roseville Marine Dies in Vietnam

The war in Vietnam has taken the life of another young Macomb County soldier. PFC. Thomas J. Yolkiewicz, 20, son of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Yolkiewicz, 29217 Commonwealth, Roseville, was killed in action March 18 by enemy small arms fire 10 miles west of Da Nang.

Yolkiewicz, who enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps last June, shortly after graduating from Roseville High School, had been with the 1st marine Division, G Company since arriving in Vietnam January 13.

Besides his parents, he is survived by a brother, Dale, at home, maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Jankowski, of St. Clair Shores, and paternal grandmother, Mrs. Eva Yolkiewicz of Detroit.

Burial arrangements by the Kaul Funeral Home, 27830 Gratiot, Roseville, pending the arrival of the body from Vietnam.
